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Minutes No. 152: Minutes of the January 16, 2025, public Meeting of the Texas Facilities Commission in Austin, Travis County, Texas.

After providing notice as required by the Texas Open Meetings Act, the Texas Facilities Commission held an open meeting at the Central Services Building, 1711 San Jacinto Boulevard, Commission Conference Room 402, Austin, Texas, on Thursday, January 16, 2025, commencing at 9:00 a.m. Chairman Bailey called the meeting to order. Commissioners Wagner, Betancourt, Wetmore and Clay were present. Commissioner Isbell and Signorelli were absent.
